## 4. First-aid Measures

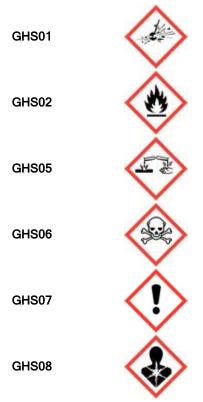
